

Obligations of your organisation towards the data subject

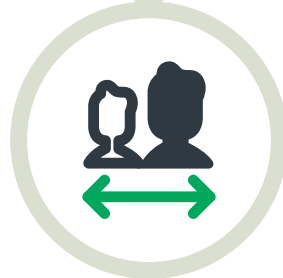
-  demonstrate compliance
-  implement privacy by design
-  joint controllers clarify their arrangements
-  clear agreements between controllers and processors
-  processors only work on written instructions
-  controllers keep records of all processings
-  controllers and processors guarantee security
-  controllers notify the data subject of a breach

Rights of the data subject towards your organisation

-  be informed about processings
-  inquire about processings
-  require to delete personal data
-  take information to a different organisation
-  ask to postpone or stop processing data
-  object to automated decision making

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Obligations of your organisation towards the supervisory authority

-  notify data breaches
-  execute data protection impact assessment
-  consult the supervisory authority prior to processing
-  assign a data protection officer

Competences of the supervisory authority towards your organisation

-  monitor and enforce compliance with the GDPR
-  require information necessary to carry out its tasks
-  carry out investigations
-  issue warnings and reprimands
-  order compliance with data subject requests
-  impose limitations or bans on processings
